Village Election

The next Village election will be held Tuesday, March 20, 2018. The offices to be elected are two Trustees. The election will be held at the Town of Triangle Municipal Building at 2612 Liberty Street between the hours of 12:00 noon to 9:00 p.m.

Reminders:

- **Water Meter and lines:** It is the responsibility of the property owner to keep the water meter and lines from freezing. You are responsible for the cost of repairs and/or replacement of the meter. Minimum cost of \$25.00. Check your meter frequently and use heat tapes if necessary.
- **Sidewalks:** It is the duty of all property owners of lands fronting any sidewalk upon the public streets in the Village to keep them clear of snow and ice. This keeps the sidewalk passable and safe for all residents.
- **Water/Sewer Accounts:** Village of Whitney Point water/sewer accounts with outstanding balances after April 1st will be re-levied to the 2018 Village Tax bills.
- **Refuse:** If your trash or recycling is not picked up please call Blue Moose Sanitation at 607-849-6436. **Landlords:** It is your responsibility to notify your tenants of the Village Refuse regulations: ex...No Electronics; no construction debris; any changes in the day of pickup; bulk pick up. You can pick up a copy of the quarterly newsletter at the Village office for your tenants.
